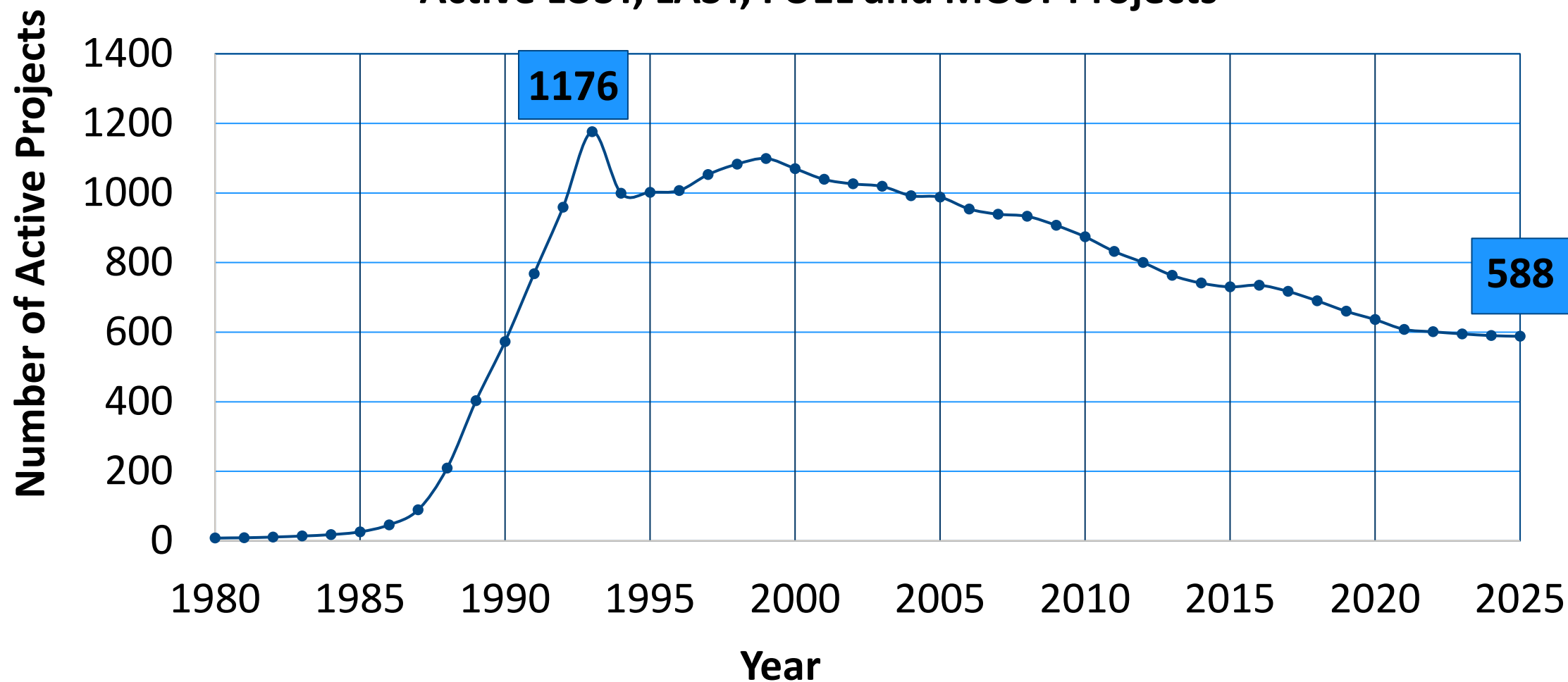

Active LUST, LAST, FUEL and MOST Projects



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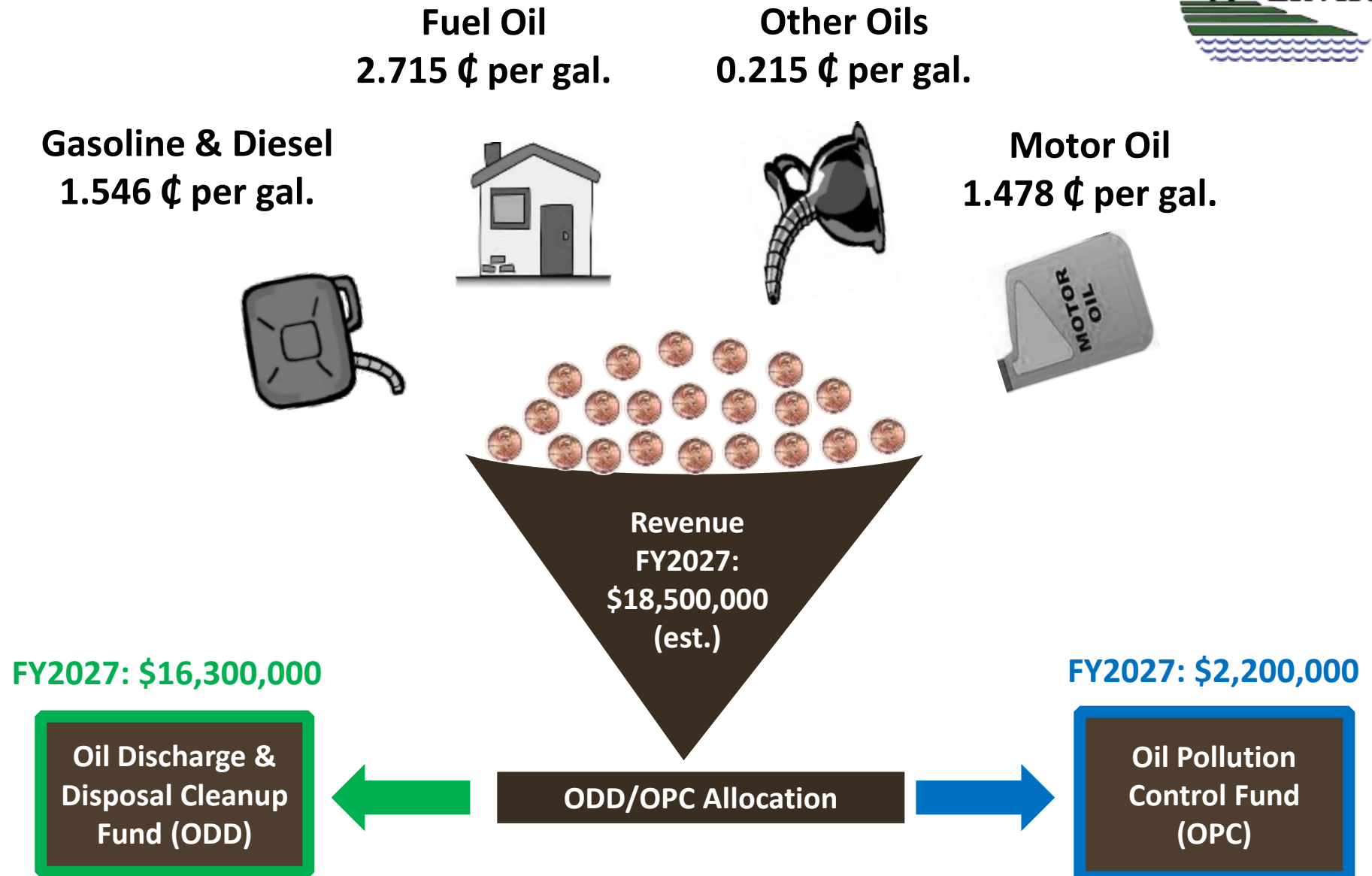


What is the “ODD FUND” and what does it do?

- Fund administered by the Oil Fund Disbursement Board (12 members)
- Excess Insurance Fund
- \$500K-\$1.5M per Release
- 3rd Party Liability
- Financial Assurance for Underground Storage Tank Facilities (Env-Or 404.12)
- SafeTank Program
- Tank Compliance
- Administrative Expenses

Oil Discharge and Disposal Cleanup Fund



Fund coverage is available for corrective action costs at eligible sites:

- LUST/LAST - Gasoline and diesel USTs/ASTs
- FUEL- Fuel oil (bulk fuel oil storage facilities)
- OPUF - On premise use facilities/home heating oil
- MOST - Motor Oil/Used oil USTs and ASTs
- ETHER* – Sites impacted by ETHER compounds



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Eligibility – The Fund is available to:

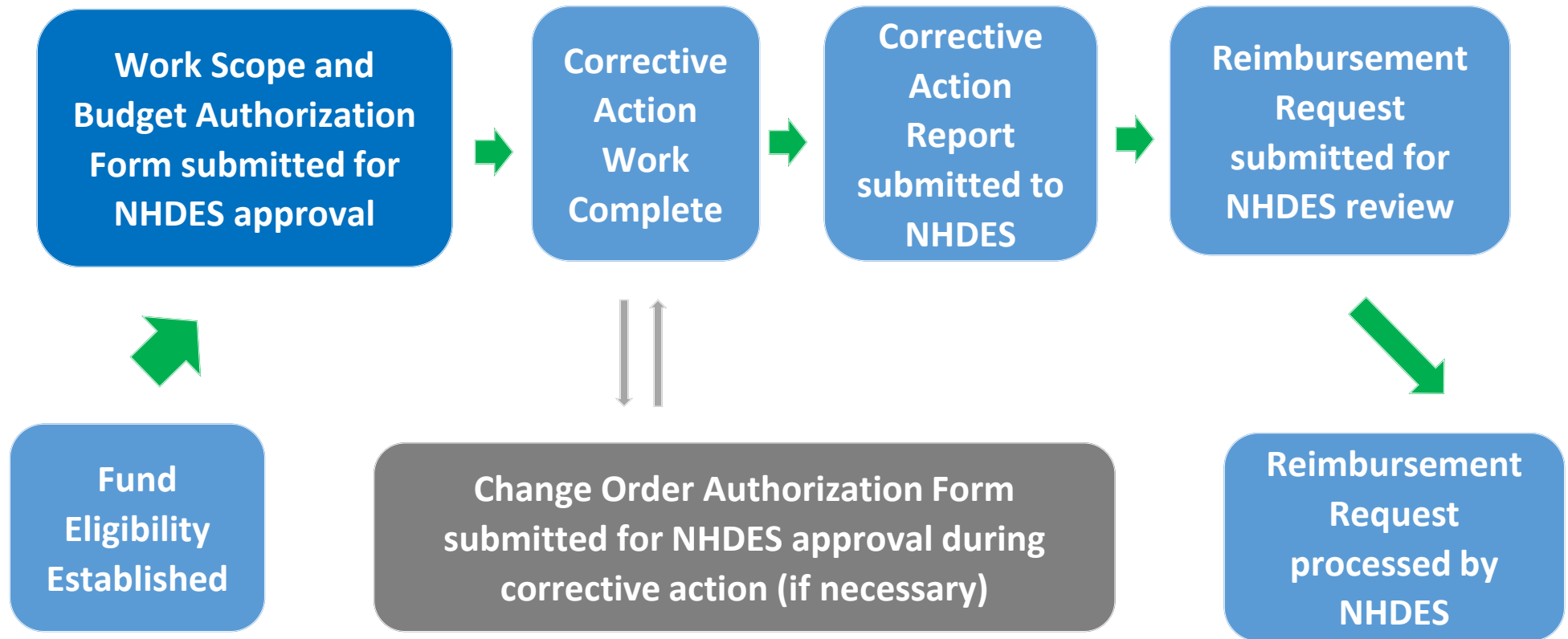
- Current facility owner
- Former facility or landowner for costs incurred during ownership
- Former facility or landowner for costs incurred under a legal indemnification agreement (obligates the former owner)
- Landowner where a compliant facility was located
- Facility must be in compliance at time of eligibility determination or transfer



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The Reimbursement Process...



Odb 400 – Establishes procedures for reimbursement

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ODD Fund Statistics — (as of June 2026)

- Total Reimbursed Corrective Action Costs: \$406 Million
- Total Safetank Reimbursements: \$10.5 Million
- Open, Fund-Eligible Projects: 801

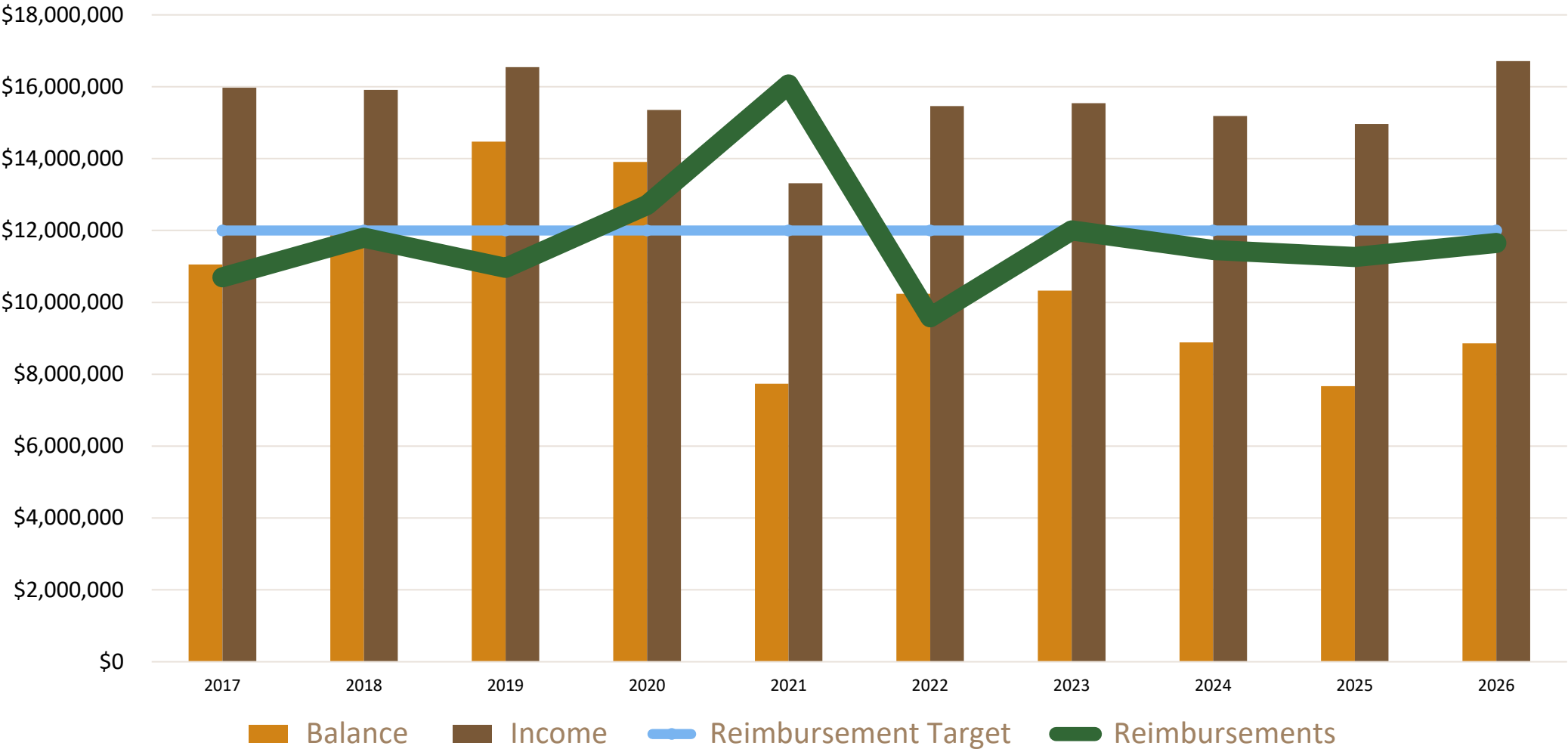
